<u>Set of symptoms that include</u>: headaches, fatigue, hearing and vision loss, severe and debilitating cognitive impairment, tinnitus, brain fog, vertigo, and loss of motor control.

Its effects are complex, painful, and inconsistent. Some victims have describe being bombarded by waves of pressure in their heads. While a few reported hearing the noise of a type of <u>weapon</u> that sounds similar to an immense swarm of cicadas filling their heads. HAVANA Act

In June of 2021, the United States Senate unanimously passed the Helping American Victims Afflicted by <u>Neurological Attacks</u> (HAVANA) Act, which will provide compensation to federal employees suffering from brain injuries.

the Helping American Victims Afflicted by Neurological Attacks (HAVANA) Act—legislation authored by Intelligence Committee Chairman Mark R. Warner (D-VA), Vice Chairman Marco Rubio (R-FL), Sens. Susan Collins (R-ME), and Jeanne Shaheen (D-NH) to support American public servants who have incurred brain injuries likely from directed energy attacks—was signed into law. The legislation, which passed Congress unanimously, authorizes additional financial support for injured individuals.
